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SHK Scale Glider by Jim Gibson

I also finished off the cockpit using the supplied interior modified in the back to accept my pilot bust. I felt this model would look good with a 10' foot cockpit detail-----that is, looks good to me from 10' away. I'm fastening the canopy using small rare earth magnets up front. I've started with two and have provisions to add two more if needed, which I've gone ahead and done. I'm also going to add some kind of backup safety restraint as I really don't want to loose the canopy . I just hated to spoil the fuselage appearance with an external release. The canopy was glued on using Sig Canopy Glue and trim painted to match the cockpit.

If possible, I like to select finish colors that emulate the full size that I'm building. I found a British SHK that I liked the color scheme for and that is what I'm using on mine, mostly. I'm finishing the SHK off using Ultracote. I've finished off the bottom of the wings using a dark color to help my tired 'ol eyes see it in the sky.



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PSS FOLKERSMITT #3 (Power Slope Scale) by Tom Fowler

This is what Tom Fowler has been working on. Joe Cormier made the fuse mold. This is Joe Mach1 who came up with the Mach-1 twist wing slope plane. He combined elements of the German WW2 Focke-wolf Fu 190 that had a 14-cylinder radial engine and a short nose with the Focke-wolf Ta 152 long nose that housed a V12 supercharged engine. I used Klas Koat epoxy paint (2 part) that is applied with a spray gun for smooth, shinny, durable finish. The #3 on the tail fin is to note that this was fuse #3 that Joe pulled form his custom mold. Note the gun blisters on the nose along with the bullet troughs.

The wing span is 68.75" and the fuse is 43" long. The bolt on wing has a 9.5" root chord and 4.75 tip chord for an area of 3.365 Ft² and at 76 Oz, the wing loading is 22.6 OZ./Ft² which is about right for a fast slope plane. I plan on adding provision for ballast. The wing airfoils are Don Ayers DA8219 root (8.2% thick, 1.9% camber) and DA7517 tip (7.5% thick, 1.7% camber). The foam core LE was covered with a 2" wide strip of Kevlar on the bias (45-45) and then a layer of 4 oz. S-glass layer at 45 degrees to the span for torsional strength, 4 oz. uni-carbon over that with 1.4 oz. over that for a pin hole free finish (mostly). The ailerons are driven by 1/8" hardened wire torque rods that have the drive arms inside the fuse and the other end goes into the LE of the aileron.

I flew my earlier version of this slope plane at Eagle Butte and it have a heaver wing which did fantastic with an all up weight of 96 OZ. in 30 MPH winds. The flight the next day in 20 mph winds did not turn out so well. After a poor launch which required flying halfway down the slope to gain enough air speed to get airborne, I went out into what was supposed to be lift. Never got on step and crashed landed into the rocky face of Eagle Butte. Smashed the nose and delaminated the wing. But Joe C. was kind enough to mold me a new 10" nose section and he had another set of wing cores.

Why go to he trouble of rebuilding this PSS plane? Because it is a great flyer and big enough to see further out on the slope.

My paint scheme uses the Red Bull colors, but I abandoned the yellow dot with the charging red bulls after my graphics person declined doing the copyrighted logo. Instead I highlighted the name that Joe C. gave to his creation. I am very happy with the way it turned out. I will be waiting for ideal conditions before I throw this one off the cliff.
